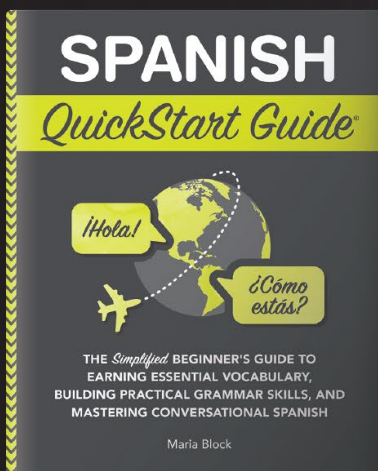

Definite and indefinite articles can be combined with words that match in gender and number.

casa - house
manzana - apple
silla - chair
tienda - store

libro - book
zapato - shoe

ADJECTIVES

Most adjectives in Spanish can end in either "o" or "a", to match the gender of the word it is describing. Here are some examples:

- alto(a) - tall
- bonito(a) - pretty
- delicioso(a) - delicious
- pequeño(a) - small
- simpático(a) - nice

When describing something that is plural, the adjective must also be made plural by adding an "s" to the end. Using the adjectives listed above, fill out the chart below with the four forms an adjective can be: masculine singular, feminine singular, masculine plural, and feminine plural. The first word is already done for you.

	MASCULINE	FEMININE
SINGULAR	alto	alta
PLURAL	altos	altas

Some adjectives in Spanish do not end in o or a, and instead end with either the letter "e" or a consonant. Here are some examples:

grande - big
inteligente - intelligent
leal - loyal
popular - popular

When describing something that is plural, a gender neutral adjective ending in "e" will need the letter "s" added to the end. For adjectives ending in a consonant, the letters "es" will be added to the end. Using the adjectives listed above, fill out the chart below with the two forms these adjectives can be: masculine and feminine singular, and masculine and feminine plural. The first word is already done for you.

For example: La manzana (rojo/roja/rojos/rojas)

The correct adjective is *roja*, as the definite article and noun “la manzana” are feminine singular.
